# Two Wheel View

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## Introduction

### *The basics*

**T**wo Wheel View has made every possible arrangement for a safe and fun adventure to Argentina. Please review the information in this document so that you are familiar with the details about the upcoming trip.

As stated in our program goals, the Two Wheel View program is much more than a bike trip. It is a way for you to be part of the overall mission of Two Wheel View and at the same time participate on an incredible mountain bike adventure.

Recognizing that this may be your first experience with bicycle touring and international travel, it is our role to support and enhance your overall experience. After all, that is what we enjoy doing and it is what Two Wheel View is all about – educating people on the environment and local culture through educational bike trips.

## Program Fee

### *Payment Due Dates*

All payments (including donations) towards program costs and airfare are due in the TWV USA or Canada office on or before sixty (60) days prior to the program departure date. If you are fundraising for your trip program you may continue to fundraise after the sixty (60) day “prior to departure date” deadline. If your donations exceed the total program fee prior to your departure, you may choose to be refunded up to the amount you paid personally.

TWV will send a final invoice statement 80 days prior to your trip program departure date reflecting the total amount received through self funded payments and donations and any balance due. Participants may make payments towards their cost balance at any time prior to the sixty (60) day “prior to departure date” deadline.



If all monies are not received by 60 days prior to departure, TWV will assume the participant has cancelled and cancellation fees as specified in the Conditions, Release and Agreement will apply.

### *Program Fee Options*

**Self Funder:** You or your family pays the full amount of the trip program fee and airfare. Pay by check written to TWO WHEEL VIEW or by credit card. A 3% credit card transaction fee will apply.

**Fundraiser:** With this option you pledge to raise a minimum amount of sponsorship by asking for donations from friends, family, community sponsors or whatever means you have to raise money for your trip program fee and airfare.

## Fundraising

### *Understanding the donation process*

The majority of participants fundraise some, if not all, of their program fees through various sources. Fundraising for a Two Wheel View trip program is a great way to increase awareness about our program as well as connect you with communities close to home where you can share your experience once you return.

It is essential that you understand how the donation process works before you start your fundraising efforts. In order to ensure that donations be earmarked for your participation, please take a moment to consider the following:

There are different requirements for different forms of payments.

1. Checks: All donations should be made out to "Two Wheel View" with your name written on the "For/Memo" line. Make sure you send us the complete mailing address of the donor.
2. Credit Card Donations (Visa, MasterCard, American Express) can be made online via the "Join the Ride" link or on a [personalized fundraising page](#) that we can help you set up. Credit card charges will be earmarked for your participation. A receipt of the charge will be sent directly to the cardholder.
3. Cash: Two Wheel View will NOT accept cash donations.

Your total program fee will be due 60 days before the scheduled trip date. However, you may continue fundraising until the start date of the trip. As you begin to receive donations, it is important to keep a running tally of all monies raised. If your donations exceed the total program fee you may choose to be refunded up to the amount you paid personally.

Note: If for any reason you do not reach your fundraising goal, cancel or postpone your program, donations WILL NOT be refunded to the donor. In the event of not reaching your fundraising goal or postponement, you may use the donation money earmarked for your participation for another program (within 18 months of the postponement). If you decide to cancel, all donations will be transferred to the TWV Trip Program Fund.

## Airline Tickets

TWO WHEEL VIEW will coordinate all of your travel plans. The bike trip begins in Salta, Argentina. It is in the northern region of the country and is accessible by air (2 hours) from Buenos Aires. The departure point is Tucuman, Argentina which is approximately 400 km south of Salta (via Cafayate and Tafi de Valle).

TWO WHEEL VIEW will coordinate all of your travel plans from the city of your choice. We offer a number of travel options and will coordinate all travel for you. Tickets are typically booked well in advance of the trip departure date. You are responsible for paying the full amount of your airfare when ticketed. If you are fundraising for your trip program, your airline tickets will be purchased once you reach 50% of your fundraising goal as detailed in your Trip Program Agreement.

## Sample Trip Dates and Itinerary

*Day 1 (Exact trip dates available online at [www.twowheelview.org](http://www.twowheelview.org))*

International Departure from [home] to Buenos Aires EZE.

*Day 2*

Arrive Buenos Aires EZE – connection to Salta from Domestic Airport Jorge Newberry AEP. Unpack bikes and gear at the airport, ride into the city and camp at perhaps the largest outdoor swimming pool in the world. After a long day of travel you can enjoy a shower, food, and refreshments.



Day 3

Salta (Salta), Sight-seeing in Salta. Salta is the capital city of the province. It is situated in one of the most fertile and scenic areas of this region. The Colonial architecture of the city is some of the best in the country.

Day 4

Bike: Salta to Dique Cabra Corral (Salta) 68 km. The route out of Salta is on a rural road through beautiful countryside and small traditional villages with colonial main squares. We will camp at a campground near large reservoir called Cobra Coral.

Day 5

Bike: Dique Cabra Corral to Alemania (Salta), 55 km. The biking route on this day will be gradually climbing with rolling hills. Toward the end of the day the road will follow a beautiful river called the Rio del las Conchas. The scenery includes lots of red rocks, tall mountains and blue sky. Alemania is an artisan village in an abandoned railroad town along the river.

Day 6

Bike: Alemania to Yesera (Salta), 63 km. Wake up and watch the sun light up the mountain sides before reaching the river valley. Visit local artisans in Alemania and then start the gradual climb through the Quebrada (Valley) de Cafayate.

Day 7

Bike: Yesera to Cafayate (Salta). The town, located in the center of the Calchaquí Valleys, is surrounded by rivers, sand dunes and vineyards.

Day 8

Day off in Cafayate (Salta). Check out Cafayate and local attractions: shopping, artisans, hiking, mountain biking.

Day 9

Bike: Cafayate to Las Mojarras (Tucuman). It's a relatively flat out of Cafayate to the provincial border of Tucuman and Catamarca with the exception of some gravel road towards the end of the day. The paved road is very, very quiet and there are virtually no real hills worth mentioning. At Las Mojarras we will camp outside an old ranch house owned by our local host and guide Santiago Aregon who cycled from Argentina to Alaska with a friend several years ago.



Day 10

Las Mojarras to Amaicha del Valle (Tucuman), 34 km. Visit with local students in Amaicha and learn about the indigenous culture of Argentina.

Day 11

Amaicha del Valle, Camping: Day off in Amaicha. Optional activities include: mountain treks (biking or hiking), Pachamama museum, observatory, village tours.

Day 12

Bike: Amaiche del Valle (Tucuman) to El Nogolar 85 km. From Amaicha we will begin one long climb. The first part of the day will be climbing to the summit at 3,040 meters. Because the pass is surrounded by mountains the pass looks deceptively low. It's not all up hill as there are a few spots where the road descends and then climbs again. We will stay at a local hostel in Tafi de Valle or begin our descent down the mountain and backcountry camp near the river.

Day 13

El Nogolar (Tafi del Valle) to Yerba Buena (Tucuman), 55 km. This is one of the most incredible downhill rides. We will descend from Tafi del Valle into the lush, low-lying areas near the City of San Miguel de Tucuman. The landscape will change from high alpine desert to lush green, forested areas. We will pass by sugar cane processing plants, lemon orchards and other farms. We will travel on a quiet road that skirts the base of the mountain range we descended the day before. Tonight we will stay in Yerba Buena at a guest house owned by an adventure cyclist who biked the world for more than four years.

Day 14

Day in Yerba Buena. During the day you will have time to shop for last minute souvenirs and visit local attractions. This will be our last night in Argentina and we will be hosted by a group of Argentine students for a traditional BBQ and local music.

## Packing

We must carry everything that you bring on the trip on our bikes. There will not be a place to leave things in Argentina because the trip starts in Salta and ends in Tucuman. It is important to have everything that we need but to also be sensitive to the weight that we must carry on our bikes. If you are uncertain whether or not to bring something, please contact us.

We will provide you with two sets of bicycle panniers (one set on the front of your bike and one set on the rear), we also have a handlebar bag for optional use. The handlebar bag is handy for carrying a camera or snacks. Because this is a group bike trip, there will be certain group items that you will also need to carry with your personal gear. These items may include: a tent, cooking equipment, spare parts and tools. We will let you know well in advance of the departure what group items you may be asked to pack with your personal gear.

### PACKING YOUR BAGS FOR AIRLINE TRAVEL

We recommend that you pack your bags for airline travel according to a plan we have developed through years of experience traveling abroad with bicycles. You will re-pack your bags once you arrive so do not worry if your panniers seem to be extremely heavy or over packed when you check-in for your flight.

The formula is for each person to have one (1) checked bag and (1) one carry-on bag (one of the front panniers converts to a backpack that can be used as your carry-on). TWO WHEEL VIEW will provide you with panniers for you to use for the trip.

#### Checked Bag

The rear pannier set (2 bags) must be tied together to be checked as one checked bag.

#### Carry-on

One of the front panniers converts to a backpack that can be used as your carry-on. Travel time to the destination can be more than 24 hours. Suggested items to pack in your carry-on are: a long sleeve t-shirt or flannel, tooth brush and tooth paste, a book, writing journal and pen, wallet and passport, camera, bottle of water, etc. (do not pack money or credit cards in your checked baggage).

EQUIPMENT

It is important to have the “right” equipment for the international bike trip. To make sure that you have the best equipment possible for the most positive experience, Two Wheel View will provide the following equipment:

- Bike
- Panniers (saddle bags for bike)
- Tents (double occupancy in 3 and 4 person rated tents)
- Cooking and eating equipment and utensils

WEATHER CONDITIONS

The Average High Temperature for this region is 73F/22 C with a historical range of 60F/15C to 89F/31C. The Average Low Temperature is 57F/14C with a historical range of 20F/-8C to 68F/20C.

From our past trip experiences, the chance of rain is minimal to none. However, we do recommend packing light weight raingear in the event of rain.



MEDICATIONS

If you are taking prescribed medications, we advise you to have a copy of your prescription and all medications should be in a medicine bottle with clear directions and a copy of the prescription.

Passport

**All participants require a valid passport for international travel. You cannot travel to Argentina without a passport. Don't leave it at home or misplace it!**

## Bike and Camping Equipment

Your program fee includes the use of Two Wheel View bikes and bicycle touring equipment.

If you decide to bring your own bike, we recommend that you pack it in a soft-sided bike bag specific for traveling. Two Wheel View does not assume responsibility for the safety of or damage to your bike. A tour mechanic will be on the trip that can troubleshoot equipment issues, however, you are responsible for providing the basic maintenance to your bike and any spare parts that may be used during the trip e.g. spare chain, brake pads, gear and brake cables, and spare nuts and bolts. You are also responsible for excess baggage fees, assembling your bike upon arrival and disassembling it upon departure. Please let us know if you have any questions about bringing your own bike.

## Two Wheel View Responsibilities

*Two Wheel View has arranged for and will provide the following:*

- ❑ All logistics and trip planning.
- ❑ Use of mountain bike touring equipment, camping gear, panniers.
- ❑ **All** hotels, lodging and camp ground fees.
- ❑ All meals.
- ❑ Program communication materials.
- ❑ Volunteer coordination.
- ❑ Program development and coordination.
- ❑ On-site consultants.
- ❑ Tour mechanic and guide.

*Two Wheel View is not responsible for the following:*

- ❑ Emergency Medical/Travel Insurance.
- ❑ Personal items such as souvenirs, laundry, internet, snacks, phone calls.
- ❑ Excess baggage fee for bringing your own bicycle if applicable.

## Your Responsibilities

*What We Expect*

Two Wheel View expects participants to be enthusiastic, cooperative and appreciative of the opportunities afforded to them through our program. Trips sometimes operate under difficult and challenging conditions, and TWV expects participants to be cooperative and attentive at all times. TWV reserves the right to remove a participant at any time without any refund if a participant violates any law of the host country or endangers the lives of other participants, or consistently disregards Trip Leaders instructions. In addition:

- **Pre-trip Planning.** You agree to take whatever steps Two Wheel View advises are necessary prior to travel, including but not limited to any medical evaluation and/or any immunization requirements.
- **Rules and Laws.** You agree to follow all applicable rules, policies and guidelines of Two Wheel View and the laws of the country and community in which you are visiting. If you do not follow all rules, laws, policies and guidelines, Two Wheel View's group leader has the authority to ask you to leave.
- **Travel Deviations.** You agree to follow TWV's travel plans for the scheduled Trip.



- Passports and Visas. Every participant must be in possession of the appropriate documentation prior to departure. TWV is not responsible for obtaining passports or visas for travelers. This is the responsibility of the participant. Passports must be valid for at least six months after the end of your tour. Non-U.S.A and Canadian citizens must contact the embassy or consulate of their destination countries for specific entry requirements. Check your itinerary carefully for all countries that you will pass through, including transfers between airports in foreign countries and re-entry into the United States.

## Spending Money

Personal spending money can be carried in various forms. The Dollar goes a long way in Argentina. We suggest budgeting US\$10-20/day for personal expenses.

### Cash and ATM Cards

Take some cash with you and exchange it at the airport in Buenos Aires or at a bank or change center in some cities on our route. You can also use your ATM card at some locations throughout the trip to get local currency. Do not carry large amounts of cash.

### Credit & ATM Cards

Credit cards (American Express, Visa, and MasterCard) are honored in many places. However, do not count on having your credit cards take the place of cash, or to be able to use them in nearly as many situations as in the U.S or Canada. Credit cards and ATM Cards are the easiest way to obtain money when needed (if a cash machine is available and working). We find that an ATM card, a Credit Card (Visa/MC) and a small amount of cash is the most efficient and convenient way to travel.

### Traveler's Checks and Check Cards

The safest way to handle money (but not always the easiest way to exchange) is to take a supply of traveler's checks sufficient to cover your needs. We recommend checks in \$20 denominations.

## Insurance

TWV requires that participants purchase Emergency Medical/Travel Insurance to protect their investment. Participants and their parent(s) or guardians are responsible for the insurance policy, and all medical costs incurred before, during or after a TWV trip regardless of the cause. ## Two Wheel View Policies

### CANCELLATIONS, ITINERARY CHANGES AND REFUNDS

You may cancel your participation in the trip at any time. TWV asks, however, that you do not apply unless you are confident in your attendance on the dates and destination outlined in the trip details. It is important for you to know that cancellations are costly to TWV because we begin making arrangements for your trip as soon as you apply. Refunds will be based on the policy stated in the Conditions, Release and Agreement.

### LIABILITY WAIVERS, RELEASES, MEDICAL DISCLOSURES & RULES

All participants will be required to sign and comply with various liability waivers and releases prior to the beginning of any Two Wheel View trip. Two Wheel View operates various trips in diverse countries, terrain and conditions. Many Two Wheel View trips include challenging components. Neither Two Wheel View nor its officers, directors, contractors, employees, agents or staff can safeguard against injuries or accidents, which may occur for whatever reason on any trip. Participants will not be permitted to travel on any Two Wheel View trip unless all required paperwork has been received in our office at least one week prior to the commencement of the trip.

- ❑ Trip Program Agreement
- ❑ Conditions, Release, and Agreement
- ❑ Medical Evaluation Form
- ❑ Consent for International Travel: (student's under 18 years)
- ❑ Authorization for First Aid and Medical History
- ❑ Copy of passport



## Volunteering - Ambassador Plan

*As part of Two Wheel View's mission, each participant is designated an "Ambassador"—representing your home community abroad, and sharing your experiences upon your return.*

Two Wheel View coordinates expeditions to places in S. America, Scandinavia, and Western Europe for one to three week development and learning expeditions. During the program you will visit local families and cultural centers, document your experience, and provide useful insight for future student and community programs. Upon your return you will be designated a "Bicycle Ambassador" and be encouraged to share you experiences.

Two Wheel View will help facilitate activities that allow you to share you experience once you return home. During the trip you will be exposed to various environmental, social, and cultural landscapes that will shape your experience. We incorporate many lessons during the trip that include:

### JOURNALING

Use journaling as a way to reflect and document experiences.

### HANDS ON CAMP LESSONS

Use a best practice, environmental approach to the way we camp, clean and impact the areas we visit.

### GROUP TALK

Discuss as a group the experiences and lessons learned and thoughts on particular issues.

### PARTNERSHIPS

Develop a network of organizational, people and event resources for particular areas where we conduct our programs.

### SERVICE

Coordinate and participate in service projects with "locals" in the areas we visit.



## Argentina... Health Information for Travelers



Before visiting Argentina, you may need to get the following vaccinations and medications for vaccine-preventable diseases and other diseases you might be at risk for at your destination. Your doctor or health-care provider will determine what you will need, depending on factors such as your health and immunization history, areas of the country you will be visiting, and planned activities.

To have the most benefit, see a health-care provider at least 4–6 weeks before your trip to allow time for your vaccines to take effect and to start taking medicine to prevent malaria, if you need it.

Even if you have less than 4 weeks before you leave, you should still see a health-care provider for needed vaccines, anti-malaria drugs and other medications and information about how to protect yourself from illness and injury while traveling.

The CDC recommends that you see a health-care provider who specializes in Travel Medicine. If you have a medical condition, you should also share your travel plans with any doctors you are currently seeing for other medical reasons.

Disease	Vaccination / Preventive measures	Recommended for
Routine	Recommended if you are not up-to-date with routine shots such as, measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) vaccine, diphtheria/pertussis/tetanus (DPT) vaccine, poliovirus vaccine, etc.	All travelers
Hepatitis A	VAQTA (CSL) or Havrix 1440: Single dose ideally 15 days before departure. (96 - 99% effective and lasts 12 months or longer) OR Human immunoglobulin: (only 60-70% effective) can be given just before departure; effective for 6 weeks - 3 months depending on dose.	All travelers Hepatitis A is transmitted through food and water. It is the commonest vaccine preventable disease.
Diphtheria Tetanus, Polio	Adult diphtheria-tetanus vaccine (ADT) Oral polio (Sabin)	All persons who have not received a booster in the previous 10 yrs. A booster after 5 years in those undertaking injury prone activities
Typhoid	Typhim Vi (CSL) & Typherix (SKB) vaccine injection : 4 weeks before departure. Oral typhoid vaccine: 5 weeks before departure.	Travelers in rural areas or backpackers. nb Cholera vaccination generally not recommended )
Hepatitis B	Hepatitis B vaccine: 3 doses starting 6 months before departure.	Those at risk of sexual or blood contacts (i.v drug users)



Note: The Malaria risk area in Argentina defined by the CDC is outside of the area you will be traveling. The CDC had defined the Malaria risk area of Argentina as rural areas of Salta and Jujuy province (along border with Bolivia) and Misiones and Corrientes province (along border with Paraguay).

Remember: No vaccine or preventive medicines are 100% effective. Advice concerning general measures to avoid illness should be sought in addition to the above information. If you become ill on return from overseas travel, see your doctor and inform him/her about your travel.

This sheet should not be treated as a complete and authoritative guide. The information presented is to be regarded as broad recommendations only and needs to be interpreted on an individual basis. Two Wheel View shall not be liable for any loss caused, whether due to negligence or otherwise arising from use of or reliance on this sheet.
